

Requirements for a World- or Continental FAI Perfomance Record

These are the essential requirements to get a World- or Continental Performance Record recognised by the FAI:

- 1. Every perfomer participating in a record perfomance must have a valid FAI sporting licence for parachuting registered in the FAI data base for the year concerned (FAI Sporting Code Section 5 - 3.1.3 and 3.3 Perfomance Records \rightarrow 3.3.4 Largest Formation Records).
- 2. There has to be an appointed FAI Observer on the site during the performance to monitor that the record attempts are conducted according to the rules (FAI Sporting Code General Section 5.2, especialli 5.2.3.1). In our case that has to be an FAI CF Judge category 1.
- 3. The record has to be claimed by a notice that is received by the FAI within 7 days accompanied by a photograph of that performance. It can be issued by the NAC of the country where the performance took place, the NAC of the majority of participants, the organiser or any other person (preliminary claim, see https://www.fai.org/record-breakers-space).
- 4. All further evidence have to be submitted within 120 days after the record performance has been madde. This dossier has to be handed in by the NAC with the largest number of participants concerned and must bee accompanied by a fee of 200 CHF payed to the FAI.
- 5. Any NAC (for instance by the organiser) or the NAC with the most participants is responsible to file a Record Claim Dossier prior to the event (FAI Sporting Code General Section, Chapter 7, International Records).
- 6. The Record Dossier handed in to back up the preliminary claim should contain the following information:
 - A report from the designated observer/judge that the performance has been conducted in accordance with the current FAI regulations
 - A description of the formation intended and performed (drawings etc.)
 - A list of the performers involved with their FAI-Sporting Licence numbers
 - A judging picture of that performance
 - A confirmation document signed by the judges who approved the performance
 - A copy of the current FAI Sporting Code General Section
 - A copy of the current FAI Sporting Code Section 5
 - A copy of the current Competition Rules
- 1 4 and 6: These points are compulsive. 5 This point is recommended.
